Medusahead is an unpalatable, invasive annual grass known for its ability to take over productive annual grass rangelands and create monocultures by forming a thick thatch through which desirable species have trouble growing. Medusahead is unpalatable to livestock during most stages of growth due to its high silica content. Medusahead has been found as far south as southern Tulare County and is fairly widespread throughout the central valley of California.
