


Kern County Fashion Revue 2015



"Through The Looking Glass"

In order to stay more in line with the State Fashion Revue, please note that some of our categories have changed/been cut. Please find the following categories to enter for the 2015 year:



Traditional: features garments the participant has constructed for him/herself, showcasing sewing skills and the ability to coordinate an outfit. The entry must be sewn by the member as part of his/her 4-H Clothing and Textiles project. The outfit must contain at least one constructed garment; participants are encouraged to construct additional garments to complete the outfit. (member must be in sewing project)



Consumer Education: \$40 limit for everything showing **including** shoes, jewelry and accessories, but not sales tax. Receipts are **required**, with purchases made during the 2014-2015 4-H year. Gifts, prior purchases, and items without receipts are not eligible for this category. Receipts can be hand-written if from garage sales, thrift shops, etc. (member does not have to be enrolled in specific project to participate)

Upcycled: Involves taking at least one existing garment and turning it into a completely new, different, and usable garment. The outfit **must also include** an accessory made from something that wasn't originally an accessory. A before photograph is **required** showing the beginning garment. (member must be in sewing project)



Jacket Challenge: What is a jacket? For this category it covers the upper body, has sleeves of any length and opens in the front. The entry must be sewn by the member as part of his/her 4-H Clothing & Textiles project. Tiered requirements - **Junior**: construct a jacket using any pattern, any fabric. **Intermediate**: construct a jacket, any pattern/any fabric, and one other garment. **Senior**: construct a jacket, any pattern/any fabric, and other pieces to complete an outfit. Other construction details such as fasteners, collar, lapels, pockets, lining, etc. are optional, determined by sewing experience. (member must be in sewing project)



Costume Challenge: Use any technique and any materials to create a costume. It does not need to be sewn from fabric but it does need to be made by the participant, not purchased, borrowed or rented as a costume. Individual pieces can be purchased, especially things like tights, a leotard, or a t-shirt. It would be expected that the shirt is decorated, embellished, or changed somehow to make it part of the costume. The more parts of the costume that are hand-made, the better. The theme and costume must be 4-H appropriate. Accessories are encouraged that are worn as part of the costume, but not props. (member does not have to be enrolled in specific project to participate)



Consumer Education

\$40 limit for everything showing **including** shoes, jewelry and accessories, but not sales tax. Receipts are **required**, with purchases made during the 2013-2014 4-H year. Receipts can be handwritten if from garage sales, thrift shops, etc. (*member does not have to be enrolled in specific project to participate*)

Upcycled

Involves taking at least one existing garment and turning it into a completely new, different, and usable garment. The outfit must also include an accessory made from something that wasn't originally an accessory. A before photograph is **required** showing the beginning garment. (*member must be in sewing project*)

Jacket Challenge

For this category it covers the upper body, has sleeves of any length and opens in the front. Tiered requirements - **Junior**: construct a jacket using any pattern, any fabric. **Intermediate**: construct a jacket, any pattern/any fabric, and one other garment. **Senior**: construct a jacket, any pattern/any fabric, and other pieces to complete an outfit. (*member must be in sewing project*)

Apron Challenge

Use any technique and any materials to create a costume. It does not need to be sewn from fabric but it does need to be made by the participant, not purchased, borrowed or rented as a costume. Individual pieces can be purchased, especially things like tights, a leotard, or a t-shirt. The more parts of the costume that are hand-made, the better. The theme and costume must be 4-H appropriate. Accessories are encouraged that are worn as part of the costume, but not props. (*member does not have to be enrolled in specific project to participate*)
