The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) is pleased to announce the projects selected for State Water Efficiency and Enhancement Program Southern Desert Region Pilot (SWEEP) grant awards.

This pilot program targeted at agricultural areas located in in the **southern desert region**, a region defined as Imperial County and Riverside County, east of the Santa Rosa and San Jacinto Mountains. Due to the unique water distribution and energy

systems of the region, it has historically received low levels of funding from regular SWEEP solicitations.

17 agricultural operations have been selected to receive funding, totaling \$2.7 million. These projects will improve crop irrigation systems, resulting in an estimated 48,500 acre-feet of water savings over the course of 10 years. The list of awarded projects is available here.
